Description:

A professionally illustrated book that reviews the basic preparations we perform for Sukkos and Simchas Torah. In this book, two young children excitedly anticipate the start of and assist in getting ready for this special Yom Tov. The story follows the basic rhythm and format of the book "Is it Shabbos Yet" by Ellen Emerman. Join Chesky and Chaya as they shop for Arba Minim, build and decorate the Sukkah, make a flag for Simchas Torah, cook, set the table, take naps, and finally welcome in the chag. Your students will read and re-read this book and (maybe help with the preparations as well!). This book is available in both English and Yiddish versions and in an illustrated version with blank space for the teacher or student to add in their own text.

Send home a book with each of your students; print it in black and white for a less expensive version.




Chesky woke up bright and early on Erev Sukkos.

nails, and finally the schach!




"Is it Sukkos yet?" Chesky asked.

So Chesky and Chaya hung up all the beautiful Sukkah decorations. They hung posters on the walls and paper chains from the schach.




"Is it Sukkos yet?" Chesky asked.
"No," Chaya said, "first we have to make a flag for Simchas Torah."




So Chesky and Chaya collected markers, papers, pom-poms, glue, and many more art materials. They each decorated a colorful flag for Simchas Torah.
